A Very Good Fourth

The annual 4th of July Bike Parade drew families from around the neighborhood, with hundreds staying after for live music, food, and games at a massive party thrown by the Thoroughgood Civic League. Every year, Thoroughgood residents decorate their bikes with patriotic adornments and meet in front of the Thoroughgood House. Cub Scout Pack 364 leads the group in The Pledge of Allegiance before the mass of neighbors rides the loop of Country Club Circle.

"The first year we came was more golf-cart oriented, but it's switched over to bikes, which we all love," said Leo Castellanos, who has lived in the neighborhood with his family for four years and has been at-

tending the parade ever since. "Watching everyone grow as a neighborhood is pretty sweet."

Angie Cooper shared fond memories of joining the parade after moving to Thor-

oughgood with her family five years ago. "When we moved here from Kempsville, we were so excited about all of the neighborhood things that they do over here that they never did in our old neighborhood," she said. "The first thing we did was the 4th of July Bike Parade, and we thought, 'Oh my gosh! We get to do a parade. This is awesome!"

Steve Clark said his family had a great time, despite having to stop and service one of the kid's

bikes. For the Clark family, getting up early on the 4th of July to decorate their bikes and "pump up the tires" has become a tradition. "Sometimes they go flat," he said. "That's OK. We worked through it."

Despite the occasional flat tire, the parade and party have become a summer staple of Thoroughgood life, with Country Club Circle residents lining the route, waving to riders as they make their way back to Thoroughgood House. Thankfully though, that's one part of the tradition that isn't reserved for the 4th. "Whenever you drive or walk anywhere, everyone waves," Angie Cooper said. "Everyone waves. And that is very rare."

The neighborhood party this year featured a cornhole tournament, raffle, face painting, a barbecue lunch, ice cream and snow cones. The dunk tank was a

particular favorite of on a hot day, with kids lining up repeatedly to get dunked, but it also featured the good-natured dunking of our res-

ident City Council Representative Joash Schulman and our Civic League President Jonathan Goldman.

The live music also seemed to be a favorite of neighbors of all ages. Thank you to the many volunteers who helped to plan and facilitate the event, and thanks to all who came!



Summer is always an exciting time for children, and this year Thoroughgood kids didn't have to go far to find a variety of summer camps to choose from, all run by neighbors!

KIDS' ART CAMP

Brandon Thompson is mixed-media artist and kindergarten teacher who hosted his fourth annual Kids' Art Camp out of his home for kids ages 6-12. Camp runs

> for four days, and Brandon leads three one-hour sessions per day for 10-12 budding artists. Each ses-



sion features a different art activity each day. Brandon says he hopes exposing young artists to new techniques will encourage them to be excited about art. "Over the two weeks of camp, we're learning about

artists such as Keith Haring, Georges Seurat, and Theo Jansen, and we're doing projects such as print making, watercolors, metal embossing, line and patterns, mystery bag creations (kids have to make something using random objects within their bags), and tie dyeing."

Brandon loves being around children and introducing them to new things. "When the kids say, 'I can't wait to come back tomorrow,' that makes me smile and makes me excited for tomorrow too," he says.

NON-DENOMINATIONAL BACKYARD BIBLE CLUB

Stephanie Foley helped establish Good News Bible Clubs at Thoroughgood, Hermitage, and Shelton Park Elementary Schools. This July, she and her family hosted their fourth annual Back-yard Bible Club for about 20 friends and neighbors at their home on Country Club Circle.

The camp ran for five days for 90 minutes per day. "The parents are always encouraged to come with their kids," Stephanie explains. We have a Bible lesson, missionary story, Bible verses, songs, and games. We love to give free Bibles and to encourage each parent and child regarding how much God loves them. Our family loves our Thoroughgood neighborhood, and we are so thankful to be here!"

YOUNG MINDS DESIGN CAMP

Carla Ryan, an artist and former Thoroughgood Elementary school teacher, kicked off Young Minds Design Camp this summer. Each session focused on a different style of design or design-based job: floral design, interior design/architecture, and textile design/ sewing. In the future, she plans to add design-focused weeks, such as comic book design, sculptural design, and graphic design. She says, "I hope that by exposing students to these different design fields, I can help them find a more specialized field that they enjoy, and perhaps maybe even be a future career!"





In addition to the three weeks of camps Carla hosted at her local studio this summer, she plans to offer individual project classes throughout the year and an after school class option at Thoroughgood Elementary in January. Carla says, "I absolutely love seeing the creativity that the students have. Each session I am always amazed at what the students are

> able to create! I also love sharing various skills with students. Having them leave with the confidence of knowing how to sew a button on, or create a flower arrangement, brings me such iov."

CJ says, "The goal was to make the kids have fun while improving their soccer skills. We wanted the participants to improve their technique while meeting other soccer players from around the neighborhood."


CJ and Ashton had both attended camps before and were inspired by the coaches they had to try it out for themselves.

Brothers in Business

THOROUGHGOOD BROTHERS MERRILL AND OWEN SCHMIDT ON THEIR HOMEGROWN BUSINESS

In 2019, when then 12-year-old Merrill and 10-yearold Owen Schmidt accepted a challenge from their parents Jim and Kim to take on a Compassion Project, both boys had different ideas of what they would do. Owen decided to raise money for children in developing countries. Merrill wanted to raise funds to donate to horse rescues. The family had recently adopted a horse named Louie from a local equine rescue where Kim was a volunteer.

Merrill started researching treats for horses, having seen tutorials online to make frozen treats. He started to develop a frozen push-up pop that could be sold dry; customers would only need to add water and freeze before serving. "I liked the idea of the ingredients being dry and the containers being clear so people could see what was in them," Merrill explained. Owen joined the effort, and after lots of research and development, plenty of testing, and with their parents' help, the boys started their company, Happy Pops.

cue you support," Merrill shared. "We researched what ingredients were safe for horses, developed our recipes, and manufactured our products right in our kitchen." The family has lived in Thoroughgood for 11 years.

As the boys networked with local rescues, business owners, and family friends, they also learned more about wholesale opportunities. Happy Pops started popping up in more than a dozen retail stores as far away as Maine. One retailer shared that her dog loved the pops, and Merrill and Owen expanded their product line to include flavors specifically for dogs (Happy Pops are formulated in accordance with Association of American Feed Control Officials guidelines for consumption by dogs, horses, donkeys, goats, pigs, llamas, sheep and cows).

Happy Pops, with Merrill and Owen as the face of the company, appeared as a vendor at many local farmers' markets and pop-ups, becoming a favorite with local animal lovers and their pups. They also developed a website to make ordering easier. Their success seems to be, in large part, due to their personal touch.

One of Owen's main roles was to check in with retailers and customers, which he found difficult initially, but he said, "After a while, I gained more confidence in my communication and I started to enjoy talking to customers and hearing their experiences."

In 2023, Merrill and Owen were approached with an offer to sell the company. Though they had not considered this prospect before, their full lives made giving the business the attention they believed it deserved a challenge. Both boys attend the Internation-

al Baccalaureate program at Princess Anne High School. Merrill also attends the Governor's School for the Arts as a musician, Owen plays baseball for his school, and both are active leaders in their church. This past year, Merrill also started offering guitar lessons throughout the neighborhood.

After much consideration and after soliciting advice on the contract terms and business valuation from their parents and trusted local business owners, Merrill and Owen signed the contract on their own and sold the company this past Spring to a local couple with plans to expand the business nationally.

Now 17 and 15, Merrill and Owen have high hopes that the new owners will grow the business to its full potential, and they believe their Compassion Project and business is in good hands. Merrill said, "It feels like a good decision, but it was such an important thing for our family that it was hard to let it go."

Owen echoed his brother's attitude, adding that the experience helped him grow and drove home the Schmidt Family Motto, which is "We Can Do Hard Things." Reflecting on sale of the business he built with his brother, Owen said, "Happy Pops caused many all-nighters, but I loved every moment and I would do it again in a heartbeat."



Thoroughgood Designated a Pearl Neighborhood



Thanks to the efforts of so many of our neighbors, Thoroughgood is now officially a Lynnhaven River Now Pearl Neighborhood!

Lynnhaven River Now is a non-profit organization that exists to further the belief that every community in Virginia should have pure water, clean air and access to open spaces for recreation. The organization began in 2002 and works to restore and protect Virginia Beach's waterways and natural resources. Virginia Beach has a very complex system of eight watersheds that make up 3 major watersheds: Little Creek, Lynnhaven River, Atlantic Ocean, Rudee and Owl Creek, Back Bay, North Landing River, Eastern Branch of the Elizabeth River and, the Northwest River.

Thoroughgood is located in the Lynnhaven Watershed, the most densely populated in Virginia Beach, accounting for over half of the city's population. That's all the more reason for us all to do our part to protect the environment and waterways we love.

Pearl Neighborhoods are local communities that have established 30% of their homes as Pearl Homes, provided an environmental education opportunity to the neighborhood from LRNow, and completed an Earth-friendly community project in a shared communal space. What is a Pearl Home? Pearl Homes are places where people care about our community and our environment and want to do what they can to live responsibly and help protect our resources. So much of the progress LRNOW has made in restoring our waterways is a result of the great work residents are doing to



change their practices and adopt more sustainable behaviors.

Is your home a Pearl Home yet? You're probably already employing some of the practices required to earn this designation! Simple tasks such as cleaning up after your pet, recycling, using a refillable water bottle instead of single-use plastic, using reusable shopping bags, and picking up litter are just some of the ways you can protect our local waterways.
